Not tonight, 'cause the fury of the wind

Not tonight – when up and down are both alike

Outside.

He didn't ask to come here, not directly...
He asked ten years ago when he signed his name
And dared a country take him on and try his
mettle.

His spouse across the room, curled up in cozy comfort, travelling abroad in pleasant places, Warm hands upon the feathery pages...

And then – the door speaks with a hollow knock. One glance across the room, One perceptible sigh, as paper falls... and book laid down... he walks to the door... and she goes to check the children.

The tranquility of the interior is attacked... Momentarily... by raging wind and swirling snow!

But quick closed door... and heavy breathing Announces the arrival of a young woman Whose haste is borne of fear. As she stepped into the light, she looked too thin But strong enough to brave the hopeless night... for help.

Her hair adorned with ice...
tinkled round the wind-burned face,
intermingled with the rabbit fur of her parka hood

Similarity to the winter night.
And garb... ill-fitting spoke of generous
contributions... from some church bazaar...
In southern places.

To help a man... so he come tell me...

He's trapper on the Turner Lake Line.

There Old Man Smoke find him...
While coming through from visit his people for Christmas there.

Old Man Smoke... say my man... he too weak to walk... maybe die there... him not know why..." The beads of light that were her eyes In hollow face... dropped to the floor and begged no more...

He knew the ball was his to throw... And no receivers were in reach... With open hands...

The hour was late, and with the sun on the other side of earth...

The trail would be doubly hard to follow.

A simple calculation said that...

Old Man Smoke... would take two days to reach this place... across the ice from mile 1 cabin.

"What matter 8 more hours?"

"What matter 8 more hours."
8 more hours to light...
And maybe even then the storm snake...
Would draw up its whipping tail...
To follow its head.

"What matter 8 more hours?"
He tried to reason with himself...
And keep his sanity...
As he drove snow-mobile into space.

No up... or down.
But whirling mist of earthly weightlessness...
All life remote!
Only grip of hands on handlebars...
touch with reality.

He has no doubt about the trail,
Whose landmarks have stood silent...
and watched him pass this way before...

Where daylight oozes through the storm...
Where eyesight fails to follow.

But... think ahead... a year – perhaps a hundred. To when this place will be the past...
And only the memory... will be carried in some... poor head... son or grandson...
Who will tell his kin the tale... beside the fire – Of how the Mountie saved their father...

By starting out against all odds...
In dead of night
And how... old doc, who pulled the sick man through...
Said he'd never of lived...
8 more hours.

Since originally founded by the RCMP Veterans' Association a quarter of a century ago, the *Friends* have been providing volunteers and financial assistance to help preserve and celebrate the unique RCMP story.
