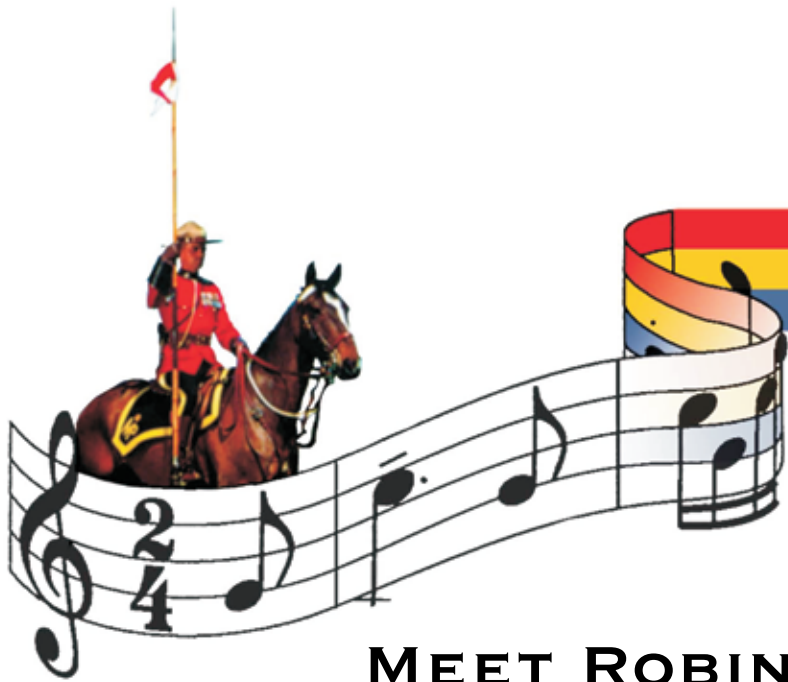

MEET ROBIN ETHERINGTON, NEW PRESIDENT AND CEO OF THE RCMP HERITAGE CENTRE

Robin Etherington is honoured and thrilled to serve as the new President and CEO of the RCMP Heritage Centre. She joined the Heritage Centre on March 23, 2009 moving from Ontario to Saskatchewan just as spring arrived – well close enough.

Robin has lived and worked across Canada and in Mexico serving in a variety of roles at the Royal Ontario Museum in Toronto, the Canadian Museum of Civilization and Canadian Heritage Information Network in Ottawa, the Glenbow Museum in Calgary, Director of Guelph Museums in Guelph and Nortel in Winnipeg and Calgary, as well as at the National Institute of Anthropology and the National University's Museum of Anthropology in Mexico City. She has an M.A. in Museums Studies and one in Language and Professional Writing.

Robin is excited about the Heritage Centre and its role to give voice to the remarkable history and time honoured tradition of the RCMP, as well as its role in the community to provide programs and venue space for community people to enjoy and use for their own events and programs. The RCMP Heritage Centre is a national cultural asset and a premier cultural facility for Regina and Saskatchewan. Robin is working at inviting arts and heritage and community groups to use the Heritage Centre,

as well as the First Nations, multi-cultural groups, the City of Regina, and youth and seniors. One of her primary goals is to work with the RCMP, including Depot, "F" Division, Headquarters in Ottawa, the Historical Collections Unit, and the RCMP VETS Associations and ensure that all RCMP members, cadets and Vets feel that the RCMP Heritage Centre is their heritage centre and home. In particular, Robin is looking forward to welcoming the Vets to Regina and to the Heritage Centre for the AGM in 2010 and to celebrating the 125th anniversary of Depot Division in 2010. Established in 1885, Depot has been the heart and soul of training young RCMP officers as well as providing training for national police forces and for international activities. Robin and the Board and staff are pleased that a RCMP buffalo head/crest will have a place of honour

NEW BOARD MEMBERS – JOHN WORTHINGTON AND JOHN HODGSON

John Worthington was born at Timmins, Ontario and raised on a farm at R.R.#1 Oakville, Ontario. After finishing High School, he joined the R.C.M.Police on July 16th, 1959 in Toronto, Ontario and was posted to “N” Division in Ottawa, Ontario for basic training. Upon graduation in May of 1960, he was posted as a percussionist to the Regimental Band of the R.C.M.Police in Ottawa. He remained and played with the Band touring Ontario, Eastern and Western Canada twice, as well as the Eastern U.S. States as far south as Boston. In September of

1964 he was transferred to North Battleford, SK, to General Police Duties. Later in December of 1964 he was transferred to Lloydminster, SK, on to City Detachment where he remained for 2 1/2 years until moving on to Rural Detachment and Highway Patrol. In June of 1969 he and his family were transferred to Cumberland House Detachment where he was the N.C.O. I/C. His marriage to Judy who he met when she was employed by the C.I.B.Branch for the Force in Ottawa, took place in Ottawa in June of 1965.

In June of 1971 he and his family were transferred to Regina, SK where he became the Federal Coordinator of the Migratory Bird and Small Vessel Regulations Section, for the Province of Saskatchewan. In April 1973 he was transferred to Regina Sub-Division as the N.C.O. in Charge of Regina

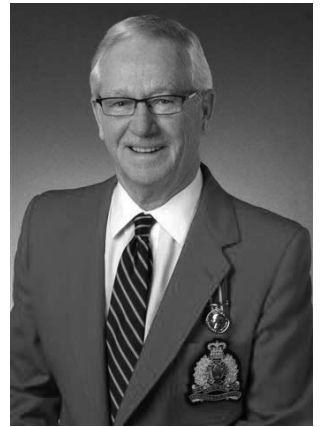
Custom and Excise Section for Enforcement in Southern Saskatchewan. In May of 1976 he was transferred to Regina G.I. Section and in June of 1976 was promoted to the rank of Sgt. In July 1978 he was promoted to the rank of S/Sgt. after having been temporarily transferred to “F” Division Headquarters, as the Assistant Security Coordinator for the Royal Visit to the Province in that year. At the completion of the Royal Visit he was transferred to a newly opened section in Saskatchewan as the N.C.O. I/C of the Internal Investigations Unit for the Province in Regina. He remained within that Unit until resigning to pension from the Force in latter July of 1981, accepting a management position with Saskatchewan Government Insurance Corporation in Regina, SK, as their Senior Insurance Fraud Investigator. He remained with that Corporation and in that position for 19 years, until retiring to pension in late July of 2000. John is now fully retired and resides with his wife Judy in Regina.

John was born in Mt. Middleton, a little country road near Sussex, New Brunswick. After graduating from Saint John High School, he worked at several different jobs and then joined the Force at age 20 on July 9th, 1953. He was sworn in at Fredericton, NB and sent to Fairmont Training Sub/Division in Vancouver for first part training and then to "Depot". His first of many postings was to "A" Div. Ottawa for several months and then it was off to "H" Div. where he served at Halifax, Lunenburg, Port Hawkesbury and GIS in Sydney. At six years service, he was transferred to Whitehorse, YT, where he met his bride of 48 years who was nursing at the Whitehorse General Hospital. His wife-to-be, then Nellie Sideroff from Hines Creek, AB remained in Whitehorse while John was transferred to Dawson City and they married a year later. Next posting was back to Whitehorse for a couple more years and then to Carmacks, YT where their first child was born. A year later, he was transferred to Spence Bay, NWT and promoted to Cpl. Two years later it was off to Inuvik for another two years, then back to Whitehorse for two more making a grand total of 12 wonderful years in the North.

With a change of policy from Ottawa, many of the long term Northerners were transferred South. Although he would have preferred southern BC, it was decided that Yorkton, SK was the best place for him. As CIB Reader, Shift Supervisor, I/C Drug Section and then I/C GIS was promoted to Sgt. Two years later, he was transferred as I/C Regina Drug Section where he remained for 4 years. When the time came again for another transfer, he and his wife, decided that their two children (by the way a daughter was born in Inuvik days) seemed too young to be transferred again and he retired in Sept. 1977. He immediately joined the firm of Re/Max Crown Real Estate and sold Residential Real Estate for the next 30 years, retiring for the second time in August, 2006. He now lives quietly with his wife in Regina.

19TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The 19th Annual General Meeting of the *Friends of the Mounted Police Heritage Centre* was held on March 24, 2008, in the Community Programming Room at the RCMP Heritage Centre, Regina, Saskatchewan. The meeting commenced at 6:30 PM.

Forty-seven persons were in attendance and 414 proxy votes were held.

President Bill Greenslade opened the meeting and welcomed everyone. Special guests recognized were Assistant Commissioner Roger Brown, Commanding Officer of "Depot" Division; Chief Superintendent Ron Plomp, representing Assistant Commissioner Dale McGowan, Commanding Officer of "F" Division; Ms. Janet Wightman, Chairperson of the RCMP Heritage Centre Board of Directors; Supt. Dale Erickson, Support Services Officer, "Depot" Division; Jean Thue, widow of one of the *Friends'* founders, Ivan Thue; and Doreen Light, wife of the *Friends'* Past President Tom Light.

President Bill also recognized the former Presidents of the *Friends* – Tom Light; Kenn Barker; Dick Crawford; Ken Campbell and Ivan Thue. President Bill also recognized those members of the Board who are no longer with us – Directors Stan Martin and Ted Madill. Finally, President Bill recognized those who have left the Board – Directors Bill McLeod and Clay Turner; Karen Worobec and Karen

Dackiw of the RCMP Heritage Centre; and, Carmen Harry of the RCMP Historical Collections Unit.

President Bill commented on the challenge in fund raising. Through memberships, donations and other sources, the *Friends* were able to contribute \$216,000 to the Heritage Centre and the Historical Collections Unit in 2008. President Bill then reviewed the 2008 financial statement.

President Bill then called on Shannon Cunningham (representing Rhonda Lamb Manager of the RCMP Historical Collections Unit). Shannon thanked the *Friends* for financial assistance during the year, particularly for the roller shelving and the display cases which were purchased. Bob Cocks, Editor of the *Friendly Notes* then said a few words about the newsletter. Karen Dackiw, representing the Heritage Centre thanked the *Friends* for their support during 2008. President Bill then introduced Ms. Wightman, who in turn introduced Ms. Robin Etherington, the new President and CEO of the RCMP Heritage Centre. It was Robin's second day on the job. Robin spoke briefly, thanking the *Friends* for inviting her to the meeting and looking forward to working with the *Friends* in the future.

A Life Membership plaque was presented to Ken and Joyce Fader by President Bill.

In other business a motion by Mac MacGillvray and seconded by Murray Grant that the 2008 Board of Directors' report be accepted. Carried. Motion by John Worthington and seconded by Bob Parrell that the 2008 Financial Statement be accepted. Carried. Motion by Bob Cocks and seconded by Malcolm Wake that the *Friends* appoint Select Bookkeeping Services as the official bookkeeper for 2009. Carried. Motion by Mike Spurgeon and seconded by Jean Thue that Bob Cocks be re-elected to the Board of Directors for a period of two years. Carried.

The meeting adjourned at 7:15 PM and everyone present enjoyed refreshments and a light lunch.

A letter dated May 5, 2009

“Dear Mr. Cocks,

As a keen follower of all things “Mountie” since 1939 I have accumulated quite a hotch potch of items related to visits made by the Force to the “Old country”.

I have read the article by N. (Windy) Gale on the tour in 1969 of the Musical Ride and seen what interest it generated. That is why I have sent you something similar, hoping members will be equally keen.

Many years ago, I was gifted a framed photograph of the RCMP contingent which attended the Coronation of King George VI and Queen Elizabeth in June 1937. The photo shows the

inspection of the Force members prior to the parade by a VIP and who, I believe to be Asst. Commissioner S. T. Wood.

The significant thing about this particular item, is on the reverse of the framed picture is a montage of a letter sent to an officer of the Life Guards who was responsible for their wellbeing and comfort during their stay. It was sent and signed by Assist. Commissioner Wood with the signatures of all members to record their appreciation of the kindness received.

I have been able to trace many of the names through the obituary pages in past copies of the Quarterly and am sure the Friends will find pleasure in researching others.

DAYS GONE BY – NOSTALGIC MEMORIES

An article appeared in a 1937 Quarterly titled *The Coronation Contingent* by Constable R. J. Kidston.

The first paragraph reads:

“Towards the end February, there converged on Regina men from every division in the Force; from every corner of Canada; to be moulded into the the Contingent which would represent the Royal Canadian Mounted Police at the Coronation of His Majesty King George VI. They came with the diversity of thoughts; thoughts of visiting England for the first; of returning home again after many years; of the rigours of Regina and of the Riding School; of their good fortune in being chosen, and, with some, the wonder that they had been picked at all.”

From the signatures on the letter (see Correspondence section), the following are some of the names of those in the contingent. Three other signatures on the letter are obscure and the names of these Members have not been determined at this point. Some Members did not sign the letter and thus a complete listing of the full Contingent is not available.
