For many visitors, the RCMP Heritage Centre offers a glimpse of life at Depot Division that would otherwise remain unseen as many facilities on Depot are closed to the public.

In recent years, the centre has continued their effort to offer visitors a unique look at the RCMP culture by exploring new, state-of-the-art technologies to immerse visitors in the story of the RCMP like never before.

New in 2017, those both young and young at heart will have the opportunity to experience the excitement of being in the driver's seat of a squad car on duty and discover the pressure of cadet training through two brand new interactive exhibits!

In partnership with Melcher Media, the RCMP Heritage Centre will give visitors a glimpse at cadet life through a first-of-it's-kind technology, the Microsoft HoloLens.



This exhibit features an exact replica Cadet dorm room. But unlike a typical dorm, everything isn't quite right. Visitors put on the extraordinary HoloLens Glasses to reveal the Sergeant Major standing right there in the room thanks to this innovative Augmented Reality technology! The meticulous attention to detail expected of all Cadets is discovered as the Sergeant Major guides visitors through the process of preparing the room for inspection. While attempting to organize and sort the room according to the strict standards of an RCMP Cadet, the Sergeant Major interacts with visitors to provide an unprecedented, true-tolife experience. Whether offering praise for a job well done or correcting errors around the living space, this edutainment experience will delight all ages while coming to a better understanding of cadet life.

Another exciting new exhibit combines the experience of being at the wheel of a real police car with driving simulation technology to test visitors' metal. Behind the wheel, visitors learn what it takes to drive a police car, what officers look for on patrol, and search out offences taking place. Visitors must identify dangerous situations and be tasked with the ability to activate emergency equipment, all the while operating the vehicle in a safe manner!

With a focus on sharing the past, present and future of the force, the RCMP Heritage Centre is committed to finding and using innovative technologies such Augmented Reality, and Virtual Reality to give visitors the opportunity to experience life of Cadets and Members in a way never before available.

There's truly something for everyone at the RCMP Heritage Centre. Stop in soon to explore an exciting and rare glimpse at this unique side of Canadian history.

ASTOUNDING DISTANCES COVERED BY EARLY MOUNTIES IN THE LINE OF DUTY:

(Information supplied by Jack Dunn of Calgary from Commissioner A.G. Irvine's Report for 1980)

- The distance travelled by Constable Armour and his team from the fist of April to the First of November was 3080 miles or 5130 km.
- Constable R.C. McLaren recorded that between September 1877 and August 1880 he had ridden an incredible 8,153 miles or 13,600 km.

His trips in 1879 originated at the Fort Walsh Post included:

- January 1879 went to Foot of the Mountain and returned on hundred and forty miles.
- January 1879 went to Fort Benton and returned three hundred and twenty miles.
- February 1879 started for Red Deer River, had to turn back. Traveled eighty miles.
- February 1879 went to Cree camp on mouth of the Red Deer River and returned two hundred and forty miles.
- March 1879 went to Fort MacLeod and returned three hundred and fifty miles.
- April 1879 went to Wood Mountain and returned ninety miles.
- June 1879 went to line (border) and returned ninety miles
- July 10, 1879 left Fort Walsh for Fort MacLeod arriving there July 13 one hundred and seventy miles.
- July 24 left Fort MacLeod for Fort Calgary arriving there July 25 one hundred and ten miles.
- August 1 left Fort Calgary for Fort Edmonton arriving there August 26 two hundred and twenty-five miles.
- August the 14th left Fort Edmonton for Battleford arriving August 20 two hundred and fifty miles.
- September 5 left Battleford for Cypress arriving there September 11 three hundred miles.
- Sept. 15 left Fort Walsh for Wood Mountain arriving there Sept. 20 two hundred mile.
