The *Friends* Group is a non-profit national organization dedicated to the enhancement of the RCMP Historical Collections Unit and the RCMP Heritage Centre; founded by the Regina Division of the RCMP Veterans' Association. As a member of this group you will support and promote the group objectives of:

- 1. To promote the interests of the RCMP Historical Collections Unit and the RCMP Heritage Centre with special reference to the educational function;
- 2. To assist the RCMP Historical Collections Unit and the RCMP Heritage Centre in publicizing their activities;

THE PRESENTATION OF THE THIRD GUIDON TO THE RCMP

The RCMP's Guidon is its regimental colour and is based on the tradition of British Army light cavalry regiments.

The first RCMP Guidon was consecrated in 1935. It was retired in 1973, when Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, the then-Honorary Commissioner of the RCMP, consecrated the second Guidon in Regina, Saskatchewan on the occasion of our 100th anniversary.

Following the coronation of King Charles III, this new Guidon was approved.

This, the year of our 150th anniversary, the RCMP was presented with their 3rd Guidon on 8 September 2023 at Depot. The new Guidon includes the addition of Afghanistan 2003-2014 to our honours, the change of Europe 1939-1945 to Second World War 1939-1945 and the return of the Provost Corps badge.

The *Friends* mission is to support programming, education and historical collections at the RCMP Heritage Centre thus directly supporting its ability to commemorate and share the story of the RCMP from the March West of 1874 to the current date. A story worth sharing

First let me recap our decision to increase our membership fee effective April 1st, 2024. A committee was struck to examine this. After careful consideration of all the facts, the committee recommended a membership increase to the Board. This is only the 2nd time in our 35 year history and the first time in 17 years that we increased our membership costs. The Board adopted the recommendation and sent all our members a letter outlining their decision.

On April 1st, 2024, our Annual Membership Fee will go up by \$15.00 to \$50.00 per year. Our Three-Year fee will rise to \$135.00 and the threshold to gain Life Membership will be set at \$2,000.00. Your cumulative financial contributions, including Pillars of the Force contributions, will continue to be honoured towards a Life membership designation.

This past year we welcoamed 18 new Life Members. Until the switch over to new membership rates April 1st 2024, you achieve a Life Member award when you have made an overall contribution of \$1,200.00. All other categories of membership remain the same. They include Life Sponsor \$3,000.00 to \$4,999.00; Benefactor \$5,000.00 to \$9,999.00; and Patron \$10,000.00 plus. If you wonder whether you are close to reaching that next milestone, contact us and we'll let you know.

It's a challenge for any organization to maintain membership levels. We had a 10% growth in 2021, sustained our levels throughout 2022 and this reporting period I am pleased to say our membership grew from 1196 to 1290. We recognize our "Pillars of the Force' initiative along with your support and personal networking are keys to this success.

Membership renewals combined with new memberships, donations and contributions in support of the *Pillars of the Force* remain strong components of our overall financial success. The profit-sharing arrangement we have with the companies that provide vending machines, washers & dryers & ATM's at Depot for use by cadets and course candidates greatly added to our total revenue.

This past year we made donations in the amount of \$203,060.25 This total includes the presentation of a cheque for \$150,000.00 to the Heritage Centre which was made just before the end of 2023. Along with that cheque, we contributed another \$53,060.25 which represented our costs / payments to PLS for supplying and installing plaques on the Pillars. All our costs associated with the plaques on the Pillars and our bricks on

the walkway do in fact represent a donation to the Heritage Centre, and now form an important part of the *Story of the RCMP*.

The *Pillars of the Force* program remains a major undertaking. It represents a continuous source of funding which allows for us to provide ongoing support to the Heritage Centre and Historical Collections for years to come. The *business* side of me says this is an excellent achievement - and it truly is.

However, my heart says the second aspect of the Pillars is every bit as important - your personal stories of service. Each story is unique and combined with all others they represent a contemporary history of the Force.

The men and women who served or continue to serve are truly the *pillars* upon which the story of the RCMP continues to grow.

For those who maybe don't know, you don't need to be an employee or member, serving or retired, to participate in the *Pillars of the Force* program. We offer all our community partners / agencies and individuals who have supported the RCMP, the Veterans' Association and of course the *Friends* to participate and stake a claim. This through the purchase of a brick for placement in the Princess Royal Walk at the base of the Pillars. Please consider sharing this with those who supported you throughout the years.

RCMP Historical Collections Unit – 2023 in Review

•2023•

This past year the RCMP celebrated the 150th anniversary of the Force. With that we saw a number of force wide and local celebrations.

For the RCMP Historical Collections Unit (HCU) this meant the support of both local and national initiatives through 143 research requests and artifact loans, culminating in a feature exhibit titled *150 Years in 150 Objects*. This feature exhibit was on display at the RCMP Heritage Centre from June 2023 to December 2023.

Our exhibit featured 150 objects made up of artifacts and archival items from the HCU's permanent collections, featured artifacts in the main galleries of the Centre, as well as buildings located at Depot, all tied to the rich history of the *Force*.









In 2023, the HCU received donation offers from over 140 donors. We were able to accept 114 of these donor's offers, allowing us to add hundreds of artifacts to the HCU collections this past year.

In this coming year, we look forward to working with the *Friends* to acquire some key artifacts, allowing us to continue to fill gaps in our collections.

Here's to another 150 years.

Pillars of the Force – 2023 in Review

•2023•

Our major focus for 2023 was twofold: (1) to expand the out-reach to our RCMP family audience, with the support of the RCMPVA & Divisions, Warrant Officer group, the National Police Federation (NPF), RCMP National Communications, RCMP Heritage Centre. And (2), was to increase the number of engraved names on the walkway to 2500 by year end. With the assistance of the above noted, our local volunteers and social media host, Harvard Media. We not only met our targets, we **exceeded in both cases, as noted hereunder**.

Social Media Our Reach:

Reach: 627,000 (up 1400% from 2022). content received throughout the year. Interactions: 13,600 (up 80.9% from 2022). likes, comments, shares.

Clicks: 24,300 (up 1900% from 2022). # of times people have clicked on a link in our social posts" (YouTube videos we've listed, etc.)

<u>Placement:</u> Between May and September, we added 700 names on nameplates & bricks, along the Princess Royal Walk, bringing the total placed, to **2536**, up from 1822 at year end 2022, a **38% increase**. Add in the additional 110 names received but awaiting placement in 2024, we had **2646**, an increase of **44%**, the largest increase since opening.

All-in-all, 2023 was a very good year. Our 150-day anniversary promotion was well received. We subsequently initiated a second, 29-day-only, anniversary offer for the month of February 2024. Nicely closing the RCMP 150th fiscal year, 2023/24.

Although the Pillars of the Force initiative is a "long game", we are already seeing some interesting trends, particularly around the engraved bricks:

- Brick "murals" are becoming popular, ranging from Veteran Divisions, ERT teams, police organizations/federations, troops, family, friends & communities.
- Many "individual" brick placements in 2023 have involved family members, troopmates, and/or friends. Also, several inscriptions have even transitioned to inclusions, honouring fallen troop members and family pets or PSD's.
- We are also experiencing a trend whereby those with nameplates on the Pillars, are adding engraved bricks to include family members, which are then placed in proximity to their Pillar #.
- Following placements or unveilings, folks frequently search for names and reminisce about "the good ole days". Visitor feedback has been very positive.
